

Poster Presentation Guidelines



Thanks to those who contributed a poster. Please read the following guidelines before creating your poster presentation.

Give considerable thought to the design and presentation of your poster to make sure that it stands out as an attractive and informative presentation. You want to be certain that the 'reader' of the poster comes away with a clear understanding of your research.

Display Area

- All posters should be prepared in an A0 "portrait" (width=841mm × height=1189mm) format. Your poster should have 25 mm margins around.

Format

- Posters presentations are hard-copy format only.
- Posters must fit within the designated space listed above (Display Area).
- The most successful and attractive posters are graphically-produced posters that highlight and summarize the main points, with the poster presenter filling in the details.
- The entire poster layout should be readable from 1m away.
- Use “Times New Roman” and “B Nazanin” fonts (size 24) for posters presented in English and Farsi respectively.

Your poster presentation should include:

- The paper title and all authors at the top of the poster.
- A brief introduction, objectives, methods, results, conclusions and references.
- Graphs, pictures, and tables should be clear enough accompanied by captions.

Set-up

- Time schedule of poster presentation will be mentioned at ISME web page as well as in the guide book.
- Please set up your poster 15 minutes before the beginning of session.
- Please remove your poster at the end of session.
- Poster presenter has to attend the location during the given time for presentation.

Recommendations

- Keep the material simple. Your poster should cover the key points of your work and it should convey the essence of your message. Make your poster as self-explanatory as possible. This will save you time for discussion and questions.
- Presenters may wish to bring printed technical reports or other material to hand out to interested attendees. Presenters are also encouraged to bring their laptop computers, in order to show images, play animation and run interactive demos. These are optional but can enhance the educational value of your poster.
- Use color for highlighting and to make your poster more attractive. Use visual displays such as pictures, diagrams, figures, etc. Preferably use light colors for the background as that is what people are used to.
